The staff of MCAVHN continues to be extraordinarily committed to our mission, in spite of our precarious funding and the social climate of scarcity.

Although the current conventional wisdom says that AIDS is "under control" with medication, HIV/AIDS continues to affect a growing number of persons worldwide and especially our youth. Viral hepatitis affects 1 in every 12 persons worldwide and 1 in about every 20 persons in our county already has the hepatitis C (HCV) virus. Both of these infections remain life-threatening and the medications used in the treatment of HIV disease, as well as the regimen for those medically eligible to treat viral hepatitis, are considerable challenges. Struggling to continue on while taking these medications can be literally incapacitating.
